## Sufism Online Assignment Due: Tuesday December 10<sup>th</sup>

Create a 5-7minute podcast on a select Sufi order's online presence. Your podcast should be anchored on the following question as proposed by Robert Rozehnal in his *CyberSufis*:

 In what ways do digital media either expand or dissemble established patterns of Sufi identity, institutionalization, authority, and spiritual pedagogy? To be more specific: how does cyberspace duplicate, complement, or alter the intimate relationship between a Sufi master and his/her disciples and the embodied ritual practices that are at the very heart of traditional Sufi piety?<sup>1</sup>

Within the purview of this question feel free to explore multiple dimensions of your chosen Sufi order's online presence and presentation, and interaction with its multiple audiences. Feel free to choose two websites and conduct a comparative analysis also if you prefer.
